Work prevents many children from gaining or benefiting from education. However, it is also the case that education systems fail to take into account the special circumstances of working children. Most working children want to go to school. To attract out-of-school children into school, education must be structured to fit the specific needs of working children. It must also take into account the needs of the families and communities. Agricultural and domestic labour must be addressed in particular because they impact disproportionately on girls.

To transform education from being part of the child labour problem into a key part of the solution will require many changes. It will involve upgrading teacher education and school materials. It will also mean introducing greater flexibility in education management and teaching methods. Civil society will also have to be involved, especially children. For example in Escuela Nueva in Colombia, children are participating in planning their own school activities. Children's councils are commonly held as part of education for citizenship.

UNICEF is cooperating with governments on a number of approaches to meet the educational needs of working children. Scholarship programs in Brazil have provided education grants to the poorest families. Such economic incentives help to reduce the dropout rates.

Demalichcha (*The yellow-billed babbler*) is a bird endemic to Southern India and Sri Lanka. Its habitat is shrubs, cultivations and gardens. This bird is not migratory, and has short rounded wings and a weak flight. It is usually seen calling and foraging in groups. This bird has a grey brown upperpart and a grey throat. The head and nape are grey, and the eyes are bluish white.

Demalichcha is found in the lowlands and hills up to about 1500m. It is a common garden bird and frequently visits urban and suburban areas. It lives in flocks of seven to ten or more. **Demalichchas** are very noisy birds, and they are known by the continual chattering, squeaking and chirping.

They feed mainly on insects, fruits, and food scraps. They build their nests in trees, concealed in foliage. The normal clutch is two to four blue eggs and the eggs hatch after 14 to 16 days.

When He arrived and saw the Naga kings prepared for fighting, the Buddha used His psychic powers to appear in the sky performing miracles. This made the Nagas surprised and happy. After having listened to the Dhamma sermons displaying Buddha's masterly knowledge of unity and harmony, *metta* and compassion, the Naga kings paid homage to the Buddha with overwhelming faith. The throne was offered to him in unison and they became pious devotees.
